The project provides one-to-one mentoring; educational & emotional support; lunch-time school & college drop-in sessions; healthy living activities such as aerobics; workshops; trips & outings.

EYST also has a Girls Only Drop In Centre which is open Monday- Friday 3-6pm, offering IT facilities, Homework Club, Gym area, Chill Out area, volunteering opportunities

What is EYST?

EYST is a unique, beneficiary-led voluntary organisation.

It was set up in 2005 to fill a gap in provision and provides targeted and culturally appropriate mentoring information and support to ethnic minority young people aged 11-25 in the areas of health, education, employment, citizenship and community safety.



EYST provides a single-sex service to young ethnic minority males and females which is culturally sensitive and caters for their individual needs.

Engage Project

EYST Engage project aims to improve the educational, employment and training of ethnic minority young people in Swansea aged 11-25. As well as workshops, training and work placements, the project provides mentoring via lunch-time drop-in sessions at five local schools and colleges, supporting young people, and liaising with the schools and families.



Safe Project

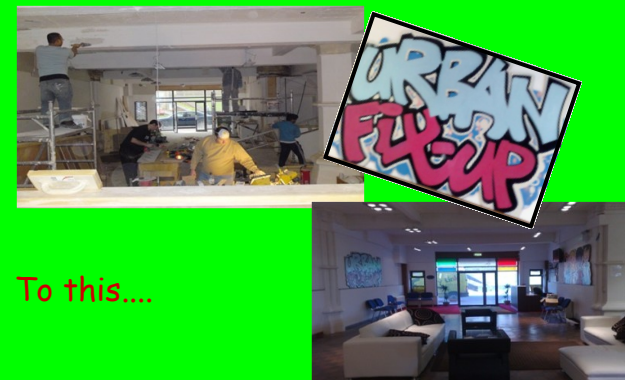
Safe project aims to increase community safety and cohesion by breaking down the traditional barriers between ethnic minority young males and community safety agencies such as Police, Prison, Youth Offending Service, Fire Service, and Probation Service. It does this by offering our clients workshops, work placements and work tasters within those agencies, and by offering cultural awareness training to the community safety agencies.
